How much energy does Cuba produce?

Oil and natural gas provide roughly 80% of Cuba's total energy supply, with biofuels and waste accounting for most of the remaining 20%. In 2020, 95.1% of electricity generated in Cuba came from non renewable resources and the remaining 4.9% from renewable sources (3% biomass, 0.8% solar, 0.6% hydro, and 0.5% wind).

How much fuel does Cuba consume a year?

This increases the damage to the generating plants and, therefore, the unsatisfied demand for parts and maintenance. Of the eight million tons of fuel that Cuba consumes, some five million depend on purchases on the international market, according to De La O Levy.
